Stage 2 Meaningful Use, Implementation Standards, and Certification Criteria: An Overview of the Proposed Rules, Wednesday March 14, 2012

There have been many gains made in healthcare in its goal to meet Meaningful Use Stage 1 compliance. New research from HIMSS Analytics reported a 16 percent increase, from 25 to 41 percent in the seven months from February to September 2011, in hospitals being well positioned to meet Stage 1 of meaningful use. The data indicates more eligible hospitals are likely to succeed in meeting the criteria for this first stage of meaningful use, an important step as healthcare providers strive to become meaningful users of health information technology. As of Sept. 30, 2011, CMS reported 2,215 eligible hospitals have registered for Medicare and Medicaid EHR incentive programs; 564 hospitals (158/Medicare and 406/Medicaid) have received payment for meeting Stage 1 of meaningful use, as of this same date.

As healthcare providers are in the midst of working towards Stage 1 compliance, the Department of Health and Human Services has released three new Notices of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM): Meaningful Use Stage 2 requirements, Standards Implementation Specifics, and Certification Criteria. This proposed rule, applicable to eligible professionals (EPs), eligible hospitals, and critical access hospitals (CAHs) delineates Stage 2 criteria that must be met in order to qualify for Medicare and/or Medicaid electronic health record (EHR) incentive payments. Additionally, pay adjustments under Medicare for covered professional and hospital services provided by EPs, eligible hospitals and CAHs failing to demonstrate meaningful use are outlined. This proposed rule includes revision to certain Stage 1 criteria, a proposed 1 year delay for Stage 2 and refines the term "meaningful use". Changes to Stage 1 of meaningful use would take effect for 2103, but most would be optional until 2014.

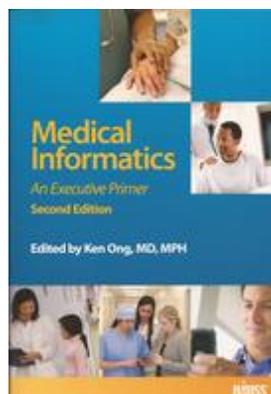

Two Notices of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRMs) related to Stage 2 Meaningful Use Released

The Department of Health and Human Services has just released two notices of proposed rulemaking (NPRMs) related to Stage 2 Meaningful Use, the Medicare and Medicaid EHR Incentive Programs that detail proposed expectations for providers and the Standards & Certification Criteria (S&CC) that delineate proposed requirements for certified EHR products. The vast majority of the proposed criteria derive from the two federal policy advisory committees that have been lauded as a model for public, open and transparent policy making processes.

The February 24th announcement of the second stage of the three stage process, reflects the desire to create ambitious, but achievable goals that enable eligible professionals and hospitals to make incremental progress in adopting and implementing electronic health records (EHRs). The three stages are:

- Stage 1 (which began in 2011 and remains the starting point for all providers): "meaningful use" consists of transferring data to EHRs and being able to share information, including electronic copies and visit summaries for patients.
- Stage 2 (to be implemented in 2014 under the proposed rule): "meaningful use" includes standards such as online access for patients to their health information and electronic health information exchange between providers.
- Stage 3 (expected to be implemented in 2016): "meaningful use" includes demonstrating that the quality of health care has been improved.

The proposed rules focus on using EHRs to improve health and health care while reducing the burden on physicians and hospitals where possible.

CMS' proposed rule would specify the Stage 2 criteria that eligible providers must meet in order to qualify for Medicare and/or Medicaid EHR incentive payments. It also would specify Medicare payment adjustments that, beginning in 2015, providers will face if they fail to demonstrate meaningful use of certified EHR technology and to meet other program participation requirements. In addition, as announced in a November 2011 "We Can't Wait" announcement, Stage 1 has been extended an additional year for providers who attested in 2011 – meaning that these providers will have to attest to Stage 2 in 2014, instead of in 2013.

The proposed rule announced by ONC identifies standards and criteria for the certification of EHR technology, so eligible professionals and hospitals can be sure that the systems they adopt are capable of performing the required functions to demonstrate either stage of meaningful use that would be in effect starting in 2014.

Together, these rules will encourage even more providers to participate and support more coordinated, patient-centered care.

As we noted above, the NPRMs represent proposals. We look forward to continued input from the public via the 60-day public comment process, which inform decision making regarding the final rules that will be released this summer.
